What you need to do to "just get you local repo into bitbucket":

1. Create it on bitbucket.
2. add it to you remotes locally: `git remote add bitbucket git@bitbucket.org:USERNAME/PROJECTNAME.git`
3. `git push bitbucket master`

But how about Mercurial - I have a local hg repo, and I want to import it into Bitbucket. Is it possible?

Trying "hg clone" with destination "`https://user@bitbucket.org/user/repoxxx`" fails.

In fact I have old SVN local (file system) repo, that I want to put in bitbucket. I prefer using hg.

Converting from local SVN to local hg seems correct, but then I have to find a way to import this, or clone it, to the remote bitbucket storage.

It's pretty much equivalent to git:

1. create a new, empty hg repo on bitbucket
2. `hg push https://user@bitbucket.org/user/repoxxx`

Done.

As an optional step, you could add the URL to your `.hg/hgrc` file, so that next time you can just run `hg push` without specifying the full URL. To this end, add the following to the paths section in your repo's `.hg/hgrc` file:

```
[paths]
default = https://user@bitbucket.org/user/repoxxx
```
